
ARE YOU READY?

You'll see a new service being offered by NAV CANADA at Red Deer Regional Airport (CYQF).

Starting November 5th, 2020, NAV CANADA will be introducing air traffic control service in addition to airport advisory service. Control tower hours will be from 0600-2200 local time with advisory services remaining overnight (pending ongoing Aeronautical Study).

Airport control service will be offered for 16-hours a day from 0600h to 2200h local. Airport advisory service will be offered for the remaining 8 hours from 2200h to 0600h local. Weather observation services will continue to be offered 24 hours a day, through AWOS during tower hours and during advisory hours. Currently there is an aeronautical study underway examining the requirement for overnight service.

Service	Airspace Classification	Hours of Operation
16-hour airport control service	Class D Control Zone, 5 NM to 6000 ASL	0600h-2200h local
8-hour airport advisory service	Control Zone to revert to Class E Control Zone, 5 NM to 6000 ASL	2200h-0600h local



WHY EXPAND SERVICES?

We are adjusting the services at Red Deer Airport because traffic volume is increasing and becoming more complex. This will help us maintain appropriate service for our customers' needs at Red Deer.



KNOWING YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES

NAV CANADA recommends that pilots be prepared for the type of service being offered when they are arriving and departing, as well as understand their responsibilities.

If a pilot is arriving or departing when airport control services are offered, he or she must follow the directions of the air traffic controllers, and all related procedures.

When airport advisory services are offered, pilots must use the information provided by the flight service specialists to make safe and responsible decisions as they arrive and depart the airport.

Weather observation services are provided 24 hours a day but if pilots want a comprehensive weather briefing or to file a flight plan, they can contact the Edmonton Flight Information Centre at 1-866-541-4102.
